



Florence County has four major rivers and 28 restaurants, bars and cafés for every occasion: fun family taverns, lively sport bar & grills or the uniquely Wisconsin Supper Clubs. For details on each go to the Dining tab at ExploreFlorenceCounty.com.

AURORA (southeast)

A slower, wider Pine River flows through Aurora and into the Menominee River. This section of rivers is best known for fishing, boating and paddling. There is also excellent hiking, birding, and hunting on the Spread Eagle Barrens.

FENCE (south)

The Popple River flows through Fence. It's best for wading fishermen and paddle trips when the water is higher. The Nicolet National Forest has camping and Rustic Road #34.

FLORENCE/FERN/COMMONWEALTH (north)

Fern is where the Popple meets the Pine. There is great fishing for 4 miles upriver on the Popple. 6 of the 8 waterfalls are in these 3 townships so plan a hike and picnic. You'll also find short and long paddle trips on fast and slow water. And don't forget to tube the Pine River Oxbow, Brule or Menominee.

LONG LAKE/TIPLER (northwest)

The Pine River offers several good paddling trips with rapids. Chipmunk Rapids has a small USFS campground with an Artesian well and nearby Lost Lake has a 27-site campground and USFS cabins on a sandy swimming lake great for kids.
